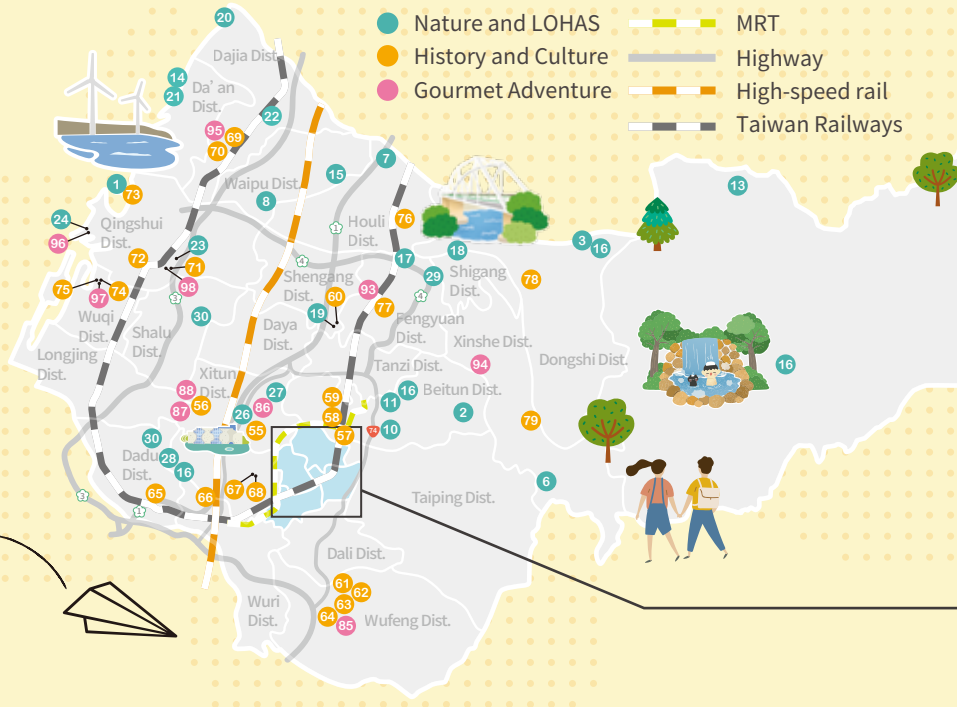

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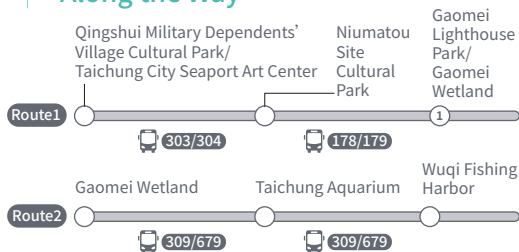

Stroll along the winding wooden boardwalk and watch the sun sink below the horizon, transforming the sky into a dreamy gradient of orange melting into indigo and spilling color across the vast heavens and reflecting off the endless sea as it does so. ## 02 Dakeng Ecological Park

Glowing fireflies and dancing butterflies, Taichung's most enchanting backyard.

Often called "the back garden of Taichung," Dakeng is the perfect place to explore the local natural environment, from insects to native plants. With different ecological themes highlighted each season, visitors can enjoy flowers, fireflies, and butterflies in spring; spot rhinoceros beetles in summer; discover the seeds of various plants in autumn; and watch blue tiger butterflies in winter.

## 03 Dongshih Forest Garden

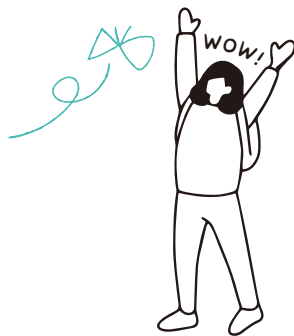

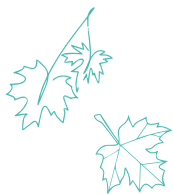

Step into a dreamlike woodland filled with the romantic purple blooms, where the gentle fragrance of lavender wraps you in pure bliss. Within the park, herb-themed shops and a cozy forest café invite you to relax amid the mountain scenery, soaking in the fairytale atmosphere.

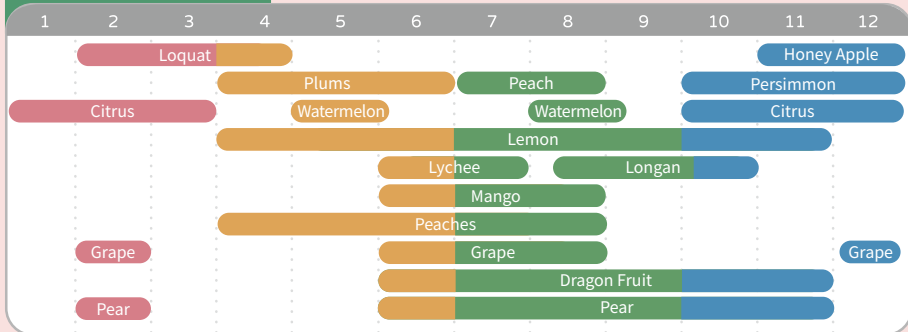

## 12 Huanshan Hunters' Hiking Trail

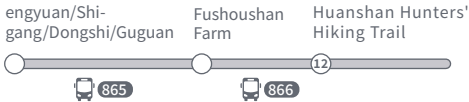
Step into the nature forest to experience the indigenous culture of the Atayal people.

## 13 Shitoushan Trail

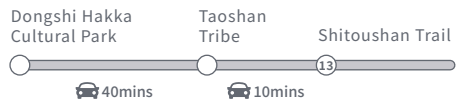
Discover the Giant's Arm hidden deep in the mountains.

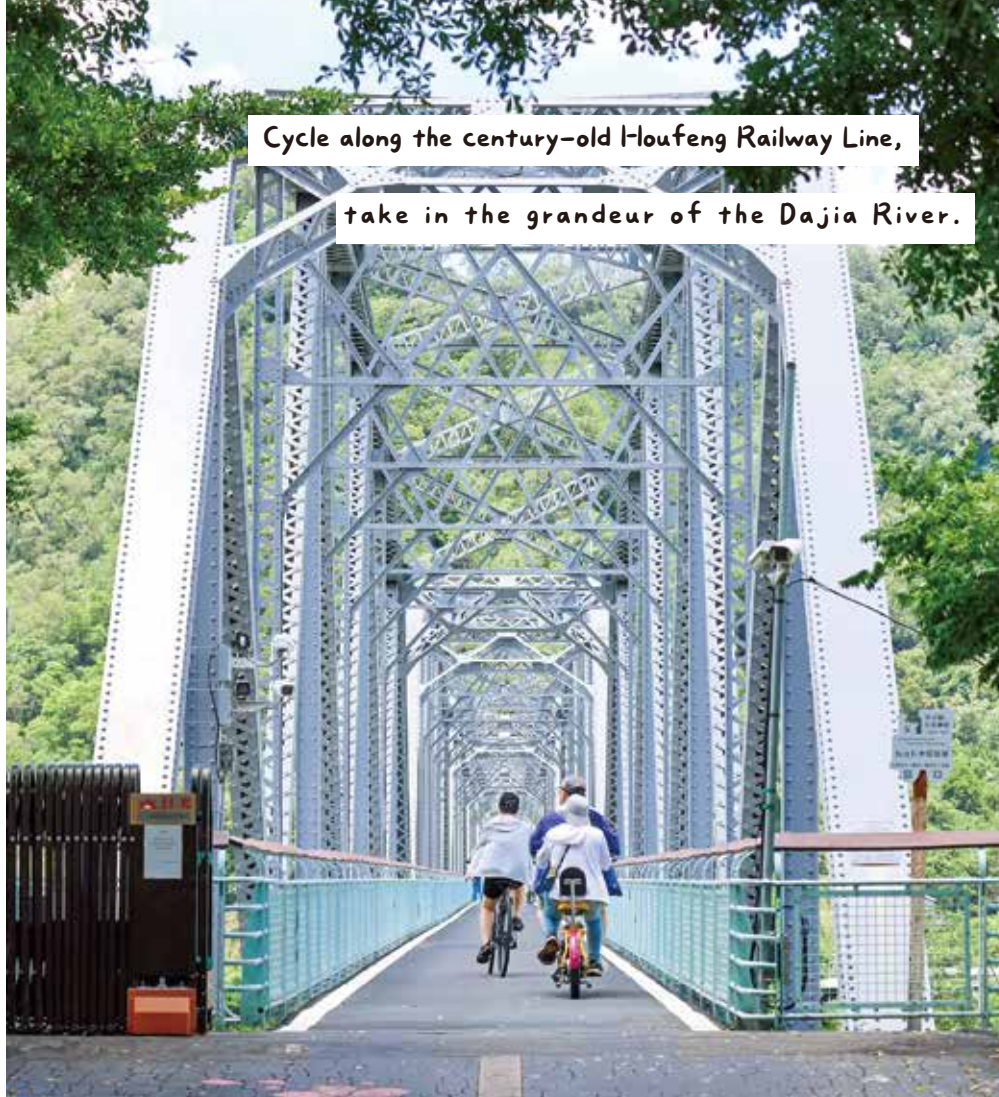

## 17 Hou-Feng Bike Path

This route, transformed from the Former Mountain line, is Taiwan's very first bike path converted from an abandoned railway. Along the way, you'll get to see the Dajia River's landscapes, cross the century-old Hualiang Steel Bridge, and traverse through Tunnel No. 9. The journey is an unforgettable blend of unique railway heritage and natural beauty.



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## 18 Dongfeng Bicycle Green Way

A leisurely ride through a green corridor, slow down and enjoy the countryside.

Taiwan's first fully enclosed bike path converted from an abandoned railway is also the second dedicated bike path in the nation. The path is shaded by trees on both sides and passes landmarks like the Shigang Dam and the Hakka Cultural Park, making it perfect for families who want to enjoy the charm of rural scenery at a relaxed pace.



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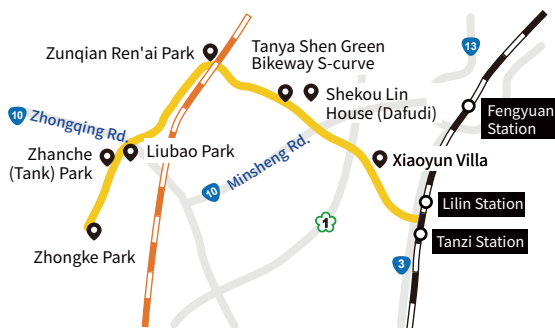
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## 19 Tanya Shen Green Bikeway

Cycle through emerald curved paths and enjoy the breeze.

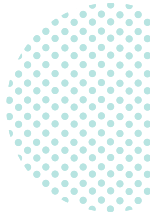
The former military railway that runs through Tanzi, Daya, and Shengang has been repurposed into a recreational bike path. One section, featuring multiple S-shaped curves, has become a popular tourist attraction due to its unique landscape. This stretch of continuous curves is flanked by dense vegetation and tree shade, creating a beautiful scene where the path and branches each make up half of the view, complementing each other perfectly.



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## 20 Seaside Bikeway

Riding a bike to appreciate the beauty of the coastline.

Starting from Miaoli's Green Light Sea Breeze Bicycle Path in the north, cyclists can travel from Dajia's coastline all the way to Wuri before entering Changhua. The northern end of the bike path, adjacent to the coastline in the Da'an section, offers views of the coastal scenery and wetland ecosystems. Heading south, the path passes through Wuqi Fishing Port and Gaomei Bike Path, where you can feast on seafood and admire the sunset. It's the best way to experience marine culture and have some leisurely time.

## 22 Tiejzhenshan Scenic Area

Atop Tiejzhenshan (Anvil Mountain), a plateau stretching across dozens of square kilometers resembles a giant blacksmith's anvil from afar—giving the mountain its name. The area has been developed into a versatile recreational park, complete with a sculpture plaza, family-friendly playgrounds, barbecue areas, and hiking trails. Adding to the cultural richness is the legendary Sword Well. Every year during the Dragon Boat Festival, it opens for locals to collect “midday water” as a talisman, a tradition that has become one of the Taichung coast's most important folk customs.

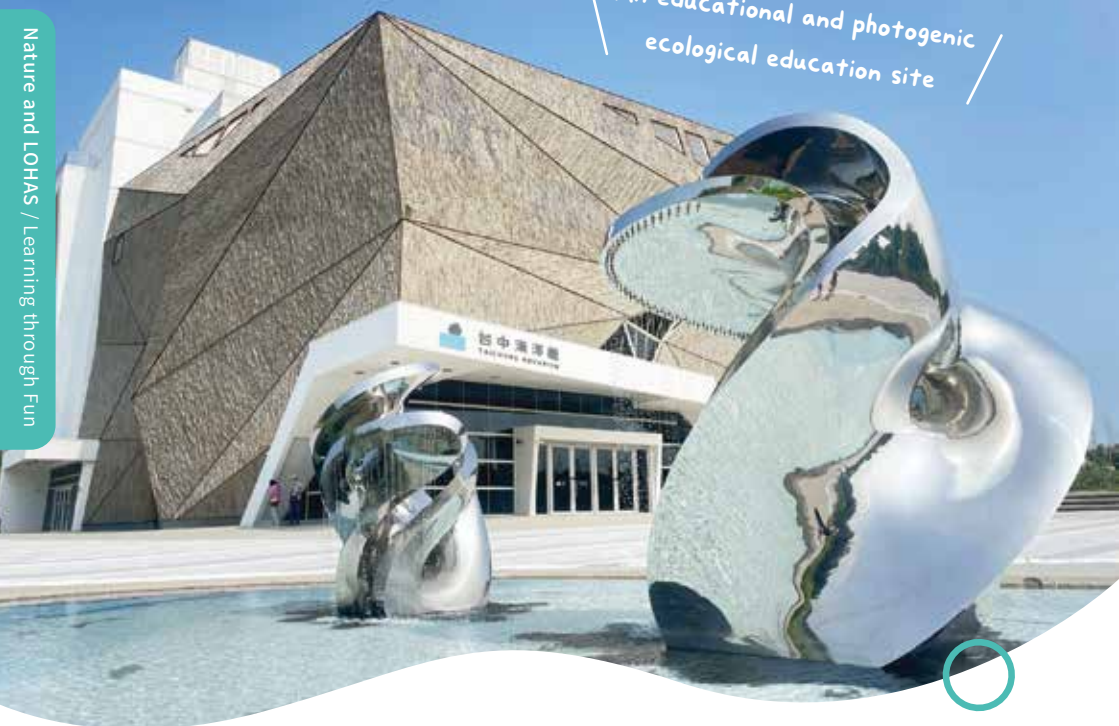

## 24 Taichung Aquarium

## 27 Taichung Central Park

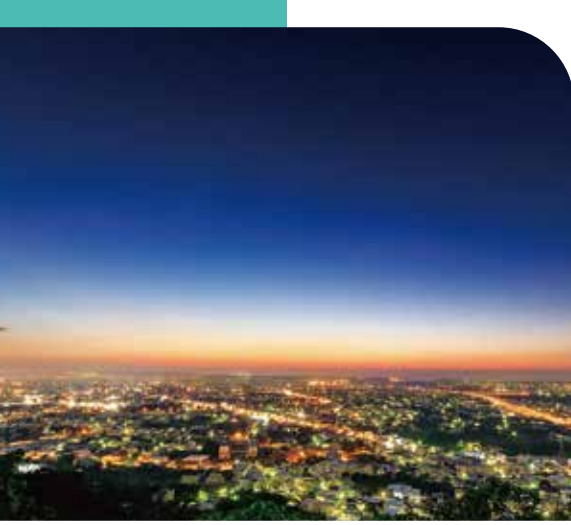

## 30 Dadu Blue Highway

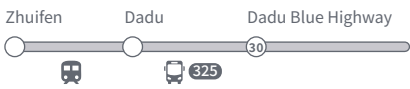
The arising street lights create a glamorous night views on the roadways

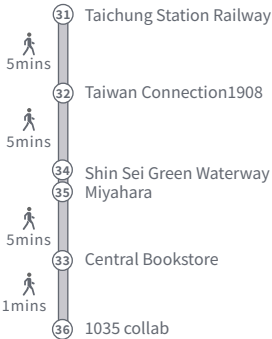

Other historic treasures, like the Wangyue Pavilion, the old broadcasting tower, and old trees, invite visitors to linger and enjoy the ambiance.
